Message Title: Jesus Fellowships

Message Text: Luke 24:13-35

Introduction:

There were two disciples that were traveling to a village northwest of Jerusalem on the Sunday that Jesus rose bodily from the dead. However, they were very sad and gloomy because they did not yet know that He had risen. Like many of us when going through a confusing time, they could not stop talking about all that had happened during the previous three days in Jerusalem. As they journeyed Jesus drew near to them to fellowship with them. What follows changed their attitude and their lives!

1. A Gloomy _____ (13-24)

A. The Disciples' _____ (13-16)

Luke 24:13-16 And, behold, two of them went that same day to a village called Emmaus, which was from Jerusalem about threescore furlongs. 14 And they talked together of all these things which had happened. 15 And it came to pass, that, while they communed together and reasoned...

SAME DAY — Sunday

THREESCORE FURLONGS — seven miles

B. The Savior's _____ (15b-16)

Luke 24:15-16 And it came to pass, that, while they communed together and reasoned, Jesus himself drew near, and went with them. 16 But their eyes were holden that they should not know him.

Mark 16:12 After that he appeared in another form unto two of them, as they walked, and went into the country.

QUOTE: Throughout these forty days each appearance was naturally made in such a way as to fit the time, the place, and the persons concerned. In the present instance Jesus must have appeared as another traveller. —Lanski

C. The Savior's _____ (17-24)

QUESTION #1: Why are you sad?

Luke 24:17 And he said unto them, What manner of communications are these that ye have one to another, as ye walk, and are sad?

DEFINITION—SAD: sullen; characterized by a dark and dour countenance; gloomy

Luke 24:18 And the one of them, whose name was Cleopas, answering said unto him, Art thou only a stranger in Jerusalem, and hast not known the things which are come to pass there in these days?

REASON: _____

QUESTION #2: What made you sad?

Luke 24:19-24 And he said unto them, What things? And they said unto him, Concerning Jesus of Nazareth, which was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people: 20 And how the chief priests and our rulers delivered him to be condemned to death, and have crucified him. 21 But we trusted that it had been he which should have redeemed Israel; and beside all this, to day is the third day since these things were done. 22 Yea, and certain women also of our company made us astonished, which were early at the sepulchre; 23 And when they found not his body, they came, saying, that they had also seen a vision of angels, which said that he was alive. 24 And certain of them which were with us went to the sepulchre, and found it even so as the women had said: but him they saw not.

REASON: _____

DEFINITION—TRUSTED: hoped; expected

DEFINITION—REDEEM: to liberate

Psalm 40:4 Blessed is that man that maketh the LORD his trust...

2. A Needed _____ (25-31)

A. _____ is Rebuked (25-26)

Luke 24:25-26 Then he said unto them, O fools, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken: 26 Ought not Christ to have suffered these things, and to enter into his glory?

DEFINITION—FOOLS: mindless

DEFINITION—SLOW OF HEART: dull; slow to learn, understand, or react; lacking intellectual acuity.

DEFINITION—BELIEVE: trust; accept as true

PROPHETS — forth tellers of God's Word.

Hebrews 12:11 Now no chastening for the present seemeth to be joyous, but grievous: nevertheless afterward it yieldeth the peaceable fruit of righteousness unto them which are exercised thereby.

B. Jesus is _____ (27-31)

Luke 24:27-29 And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he expounded unto them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself. 28 And they drew nigh unto the village, whither they went: and he made as though he would have gone further. 29 But they constrained him, saying, Abide with us: for it is toward evening, and the day is far spent. And he went in to tarry with them.

Luke 24:44 And he said unto them, These are the words which I spake unto you, while I was yet with you, that all things must be fulfilled, which were written in the law of Moses, and in the prophets, and in the psalms, concerning me.

Luke 24:30-31 And it came to pass, as he sat at meat with them, he took bread, and blessed it, and brake, and gave to them. 31 And their eyes were opened, and they knew him; and he vanished out of their sight.

1 Corinthians 1:9 God is faithful, by whom ye were called unto the fellowship of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord.

DEFINITION—FELLOWSHIP: participation fellowship; the act of sharing in the activities or privileges of an intimate association or group; especially used of marriage and churches.

3. A Glorious _____ (32-35)

A. _____ Hearts (32)

Luke 24:32 And they said one to another, Did not our heart burn within us, while he talked with us by the way, and while he opened to us the scriptures?

DEFINITION—BURN: to feel strong emotion

DEFINITION—OPENED: to explain thoroughly

B. _____ Ministry (33-35)

Luke 24:33-35 And they rose up the same hour, and returned to Jerusalem, and found the eleven gathered together, and them that were with them, 34 Saying, The Lord is risen indeed, and hath appeared to Simon. 35 And they told what things were done in the way, and how he was known of them in breaking of bread.

NOTE: They had just walked seven miles (perhaps in the evening to dark)!

When we fellowship with Jesus in His Word, it is hard to keep quiet about it!

Conclusion

1 John 1:1-4 That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked upon, and our hands have handled, of the Word of life; 2 (For the life was manifested, and we have seen it, and bear witness, and shew unto you that eternal life, which was with the Father, and was manifested unto us;) 3 That which we have seen and heard declare we unto you, that ye also may have fellowship with us: and truly our fellowship is with the Father, and with his Son Jesus Christ. 4 And these things write we unto you, that your joy may be full.
